Improvement priority: *Educational Achievement* -



Implement a repertoire of pedagogical approaches for all students, particularly to lift student achievement from B to A in English.
Expand current collegial practices to include ongoing teacher capability development.

Strategies: Implement a whole-school approach to the teaching of reading and spelling.
Develop a whole school approach to pedagogy to support student achievement.
Implement Australian Curriculum Version 9 in English, maths and science.
Develop formalised opportunities for teachers to participate in Watching Others Work.

Provide feedback to Prep – Year 2 teachers to assist reflection on, and improvement in their professional practice. Strengthen practice and consistency by providing teachers with opportunities to watch each other work. <p><i>Shared and Dialogic Reading</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Identify teachers to establish a team to build a shared understanding and lead a trial of the AHSS Instructional Model for Teaching Shared and Dialogic Reading. Build capacity of staff by providing professional development opportunities. Develop processes for collaborative planning of shared and dialogic reading routines using rich curriculum texts aligned to the instructional model (planning days). Commence implementation of the model. Promote Tier 1 evidence based instructional practices that promote predictability and inclusion for all students. Investigate a consistent approach to instruction for and identification of students requiring Tier 2 and 3 supports. Commence review of Support Teacher roles and responsibilities to ensure alignment to MTSS.
